P.S.S.A. CONGRESS 1964

BOOKINGS made through P.S.S.A. for the 1964 congress in the Kruger National Park have now been confirmed, and anyone who has applied through us and has not yet been notified should immediately contact R. D. Stephen, P.O. Box 9502, Johannesburg or telephone 51-4116 between 5 p.m. and 7 p.m. any evening.

No individual deposit will be required as P.S.S.A. has made a sufficient deposit covering all applicants, however anyone not taking up their accommodation will be required to make good the deposit to P.S.S.A. as the amount will be deducted from our overall deposit.

Each party will be issued with a letter of authority from P.S.S.A. certifying membership of the Congress, and detailing the accommodation allotted. This must be presented at the entrance gate to the Kruger Park and payment in full must be made for the duration of stay in the reserve.

Each individual adult will be required to pay R3.00 registration fees to cover the Annual Dinner and other expenses of congress.

If you have not booked through P.S.S.A. there is still time to do so through the Parks Board in Pretoria. But please let R. D. Stephen know you are attending congress so that you may be advised about what is happening.

Dear Photo-friends,

Many thanks for your letter of May 1964.

We are glad to learn that you will participate in our International Photographic Exhibition.

As we already told you, 20 prints sized 30 x 40 cm or even bigger are required and will be exhibited without a jury's previous approval. These prints will represent the amateur photography of your country resp. continent, and we leave the selection of the prints to you but kindly ask you not to send us coloured prints.

Please indicate the title as well as the name and address of the photographer on the back of the prints. The prints sent to us may be mounted or not, however, we would ask your permission to mount those prints which are not mounted.

The forwarding of the prints should be arranged so that they will arrive here in February 1965 at the latest. Please inform us about the forwarding expenses in order to allow us to reimburse you same in the way which you suggest.

We would very much appreciate your allowing us to publish some of the prints in newspapers of this city, without remuneration, in order to make some advertising for our exhibition.

When the exhibition is opened on the 4th April, 1965, we will have judged the prints by a jury who is composed of well-known photographers of the Gemeinschaft Deutscher Lichtoildner (GDL—Federation of German Photographers). FIAP and VDAV medals as well as prizes will be granted for the best single prints and for the best collection of a group.

It goes without saying that the prints will be treated as carefully as possible, however, we cannot be held responsible for any damage or loss during the transport.

The prints will be returned immediately after the exhibition has come to its end.
