## PRESIDENT OF THE SOCIETY

Dr. J. K. du Toit has again been elected President of the Society for the year. Our congratulations go to him.

## PRESIDENTIAL NOTES

Several things have happened since Congress, and are busy happening, and it is probably just as well to bring all members of P.S.S.A. into the picture.

First of all, it was announced at Congress that an invitation was received from the South Coast Camera Club to hold the 1965 Congress there. This invitation was more than welcome and readily accepted, and its acceptance was announced at the 1964 Congress in Pretoriusskop. We have now been informed, during March of this year, that they no longer see their way clear to hold Congress there due to unsurpassable obstacles.

The outcome of this will probably be that we will have to postpone Congress to a later date, probably April of 1966, which will coincide with another suggestion that we should change our financial year to the end of March of each year.

Another problem which has arisen, is the most suitable date for the Protea Salon, official salon of P.S.S.A. The University of Pretoria came forward last year with an offer of assistance (financially and otherwise) provided the Salon was exhibited on the University Campus (the Rautenbach Hall) and could be open to student participation, as part of a cultural programme.

Unfortunately, in order to do so this year, the Protea Salon will have to clash with the Witwatersrand Salon—something we cannot allow to happen. It would therefore appear to be in the interests of all concerned if the Protea Salon is postponed to March, 1966, and in future exhibited during that month i.e. preceding the S.A. Salon in Johannesburg. Further announcements on these two issues, Congress and the Protea Salon, will be made as soon as possible.

At the last annual general meeting it was suggested that certain alterations be made to classes of membership. A sub-committee has been considering this for some time, but nothing has yet been finalised. The matter has not, however, been forgotten.

## P.S.S.A. LION TROPHY

This trophy is a 4½in. silver-plated lion mounted on a mahogany base.

It will be awarded to all Salons that apply for P.S.S.A. approval, and receive such approval. The trophy is to be awarded to the most meritorious print or slide at the Salon, and at the Judges' discretion.

Clubs, in the future, are requested to apply for P.S.S.A. approval in order to qualify. Rules and regulations approving salons will shortly be circulated to all member clubs.

Next rung of the success ladder is Associateship of Photographic Society of Southern Africa, and with it the internationally recognised honour of scribing after their names 'A.P.S. (S.A.)'.

Top of the ladder, and highest award for merit in photography which our national body can bestow is Fellowship, and the distinction of the letters F.P.S. (S.A.).

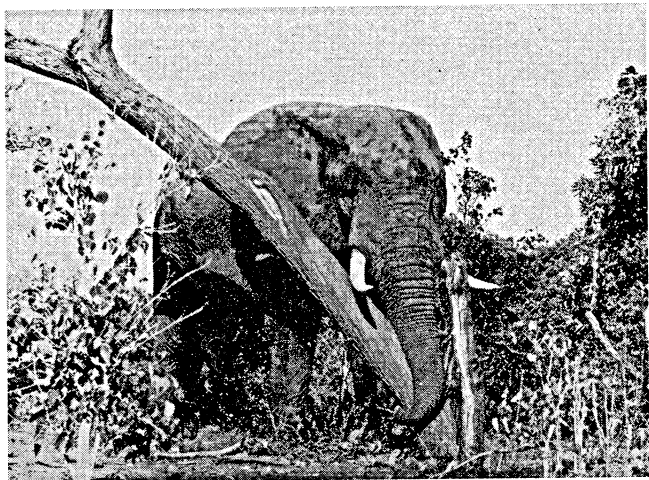
Fellowship is not easily attained. It is granted only to associates who have qualified in three sections. For example, having qualified in the different sections of Colour Slides, Recorded Slide Programmes, and Black and White prints. Applications can be made in all three sections at the same time, or over a period of years.

Applications for Associateship are considered *once* only each year. They close on June 15. Write to the Hon. Secretary, Honours and Awards Committee, P.S.S.A., P.O. Box 2007, Johannesburg, for application for associateship form containing full particulars.
