





Crossing unforgettable panoramas, stopping in their yurts in real contact, as we like in our travels these knights who leave from the most remote areas of Altai to reach Ulgi. This is where the party takes place which will last two days where the competitions are the most loved in the Kazakh tradition: the eagles' skill tests the horse race, and the Kukbar where riders fight to take possession of a fox skin. In the end the awards ceremony, then the long return.










"A Troubled Country" by Sheila Haycox – United Kingdom





"AJA MOLA" – Marcello Tramandoni and Teofilo Celani, Italy

Gioacchino Cataldo, who passed away in July 2018, was a tuna fisherman on Favignana Island, in Sicily. Gioacchino's story is closely connected to Egadi Islands, to which Favignana belongs, and in particular to Stabilimento Florio, where he started to work really young. For 33 years he worked as tonnarotto and in 1996 he became rais of the fishermen (Arabic word meaning "leader"). He has been rais for 11 years, during the most difficult period of the tonnara, namely till 2007, the last year of tuna fishing in Favignana. In May tuna coming from Gibraltar swim towards warm beaches of Mediterranean Sea, where they reproduce. During the tuna fishing fishermen perform propitiatory songs; the most famous one is called AJA MOLA. This name comes from the Arabic ai ya mawla [ai aià maulà] (O my Lord). It is a responsorial song; the soloist's voice is echoed by the chorus of fishermen pulling their nets aboard. "Muciare" is the name of the dark ships used during the tuna fishing. The slow, strongly rhythmic pace accompanies the effort during the first phase of the surfacing of the nets. Because of his dissemination activity on the traditions related to this kind of fishing, in 2006 Gioacchino was recognised as "Living Human Treasure" in the register of Intangible Cultural Heritage of Sicily, a document aiming at safeguarding the cultural richness of the Island. Marcello Tramandoni's photographic report illustrates one of the last tuna fishing in Favignana Island and managed by the rais Gioacchino Cataldo, with the assistance of Clemente Ventrone, as vice rais.

He gives a loving and consoling interpretation of death: those we have loved and mourned for so long are not far from us, they have only passed over to the other side. And there can be no final separation as long as the memory survives.

"Today is the day" expresses the urgency of a courageous and radical change of direction that must involve above all those who hold decision-making and responsibility roles.

Glass facades of greenhouses sometimes get dirty and grown with organisms. Where panes overlap, micro landscapes are created.




"Pareidolia"
















"In Admiration of Ansel" – Alastair Taylor, United Kingdom





SALON DIRECTOR'S REPORT

This is the 6th International Audio Visual Salon which I have administered on behalf of the Port Elizabeth Camera Club. These salons have been presented every second year since 2014 and in very much the same time slot. All salons were granted patronage by both FIAP and PSSA.

On the jury again this year is Adri van Oudheusden AV-AFIAP, AV-FPSSA, EPSSA, APSSA (Vers) and Jill Sneesby Hon MPSSA, FPSSA Dux, AV-FPSSA, MFIAP, ESFIAP, FPSA. Our guest judge from England is well-known AV maker, lecturer and AV honours holder, Ian Bateman FRPS MPAGB AV-AFIAP APAGB.

Judging was done remotely. Each judge had access to all the entries to view at his/her own time using their own calibrated equipment and stereo sound system for optimum viewing.

The judges completed their individual scoring timeously and before the date set. The collated scores were then returned to the judges for review and discussion. These combined results were then discussed via video call until consensus was reached on the relevant acceptance levels as well as all the awards.

The results were reported and approved by PSSA on 11 April and then also uploaded to the FIAP platform. This amicable and quick resolution of the results allowed that all the individual results were e-mailed by 13 April, ahead of the target date set in the salon calendar of 21 April 2024.

None of the jury participated in this salon and neither did a member of the host club win any top award

This year we again offered the entrants the choice of two categories: Open and Photo Harmony.

Whilst the closing date was 21 March 2024, our first entries were already submitted in August 2023!



We are not disappointed with our entry of 109 (97) in Open and 24 (30) in Photo Harmony, the combined total of 133 (127) AVs.

The variety in subject matter is always a delight. No submissions were disqualified.

There was a remarkable increase in the use of artificial intelligence (AI) this year, specifically for narration. Some were difficult to recognise whilst others were obvious. It is an advantage you could use if you need to translate your script and you can't find a native speaker of that language.

The geographic spread of the entrants has changed very little but we had no entries from Germany nor Poland this time and wonder why. The dominant entrants are English speaking, followed by Dutch, Italian and French: UK 26% Australia 20% South Africa 19% Netherlands 12% France 9% Italy 8%

Ireland, Belgium and Slovakia each represented 2% and we had our first entry from Canada.

We are governed by the rules of the organizations which grant us patronage and where there is a difference in rules between FIAP and PSSA, the stricter rule has to be applied. The PSSA guideline is to have an acceptance percentage 25-40% (25-35%)
