

Another cold and wet month behind us, bringing us closer to summer, with many opportunities to photograph the Canola, which will be coming out soon.

Despite these conditions, some of our members still went out on the various outings that were organised. The Zeitz MOCCA Contemporary Art Africa Museum saw a fair number of our members attending on a cold and wet Wednesday morning, and we were treated to some of the art displays as well the architectural marvel that has been created by Thomas Heatherwick, featuring 80 art galleries. This Museum has been repurposed from the old grain silos into this modern day art museum.

A few weekends later on a clear sunny morning, we ventured out to Klaasenbosch Green belt looking for fungi, and what a treat, John Rayner explaining the different types, and pointing out all shapes and sizes to us.

Our last L&S (Education) evening turned out to be very interesting, with some very valuable discussions taking place around EXIF data and the need to retain our original images in case a Salon Director called for it for verification. PSSA has become very strict in enforcing the "No Manipulation" rule, which Rob has covered in previous issues of The Bellows. The discussion developed into image naming and renaming rules, and conversion of images, all of which is covered in our House Rules. I would encourage all our members to revisit the House Rules from time to time, even if just to refresh your memory about images and competition criteria.

The L&S evening also offers you an opportunity to ask for further comments from those present, about the judge's comments, which you may or may not have agreed with. Those who have attended have gained valuable input and this has helped them progress on their photographic journey.

John has advised that our next outing will be to Stellenbosch. Please watch on the WhatsApp group for more information on this and other outings.

Another first for us was that at our July club competition we had 2 judges, Steffne for the set subject and Darryll for the open. David and Tammy did very well in handling the recordings from Darryll.

10 members attended in person, with 14 members joining via Zoom.

This month's set subject

Nature/Wildlife

DEFINITIONS

Nature photography is restricted to the use of the photographic process to depict all branches of natural history, except anthropology and archaeology, in such a fashion that a well-informed person will be able to identify the subject material and certify its honest presentation. Wildlife photography is further defined as one or more zoological or botanical organisms living free and unrestrained in a natural or adopted habitat.

Wildlife is not limited to animals, birds and insects. Marine subjects and botanical subjects (including fungi and algae) taken in the wild are suitable wildlife subjects, as are carcasses of extant species. Landscapes, geological formations, photographs of zoo or game farm animals or any zoological or botanical species taken under controlled conditions, such as zoos, games farms, botanical gardens, aquariums and any enclosure where the subjects are totally dependent on man for food, are not allowed.


