





The social media storm in our lives



We have to acknowledge the influence of social media in our day to day goings on.

We are all familiar with platforms like Facebook, Instagram and Pinterest where we can post our memories, ask questions, show our travels and find out what is going on in the world.

This however, is far from the only ones. I ventured to research it a bit and found sites, some I didn't even know existed.

Some of the top Social Media Sites and Platforms:

- 1. Facebook A broad platform for connecting with friends and family, sharing updates, photos, and videos (3.07 billion users)
- 2. YouTube Primarily for video content, including entertainment, education, and news.
- 3. Instagram Focused on photo and video sharing, often with a focus on aesthetics and lifestyle (2 billion users)
- 4. TikTok A platform known for short-form video content and trends.
- 5. Snapchat Popular for sending disappearing photos and videos, especially among younger users. (850 million users)
- 6. X/Twitter A platform for real-time updates, news, and public conversations through short messages.
- 7. Pinterest A visual discovery engine for finding and sharing ideas, often used for inspiration
- 8. Reddit A collection of online forums where users can share content and discuss various topics.

Is it all bad? Many will say so. Many will say it is 50/50. Many will shoot it down as rubbish.

The advantage is that it provides connectivity, builds community and is affordable advertising.

The cons can be disinformation or misinformation, sleep disruption, mental health impact, child sex exploitation........

The fact is that we will never be able to cover most of what social media means. Therefore, we focus on one or two platforms we feel we can manage.

The original layout on Instagram used to be the square cropping. After some time, vertical and horizontal formats were added. This feature allowed photographers on Instagram to showcase their pictures with a minimal format edition. One problem arose, however - Vertical images are much larger than their horizontal counterparts.

In a space where you have only a fraction of a second to catch your audience's attention, this size difference can be crucial. As a result, photographers on Instagram started publishing vertical crops of their photos and sharing the full version on their stories. Eventually, the carousel post feature became the preferred alternative to display horizontal photos in full size within the Instagram feed

There is a platform for everyone. You choose what works for you.

However, for now, I want to pause on Instagram for photography purposes. That is what works for my generation.

Creativity is important. The overstaged scenes are a thing of the past. Show it as it is. Be done with fake realities. Try and add more personal content for instance when taking a beautiful nature shot. Start writing longer captions talking about the image's backstory, show some behind the scene's footage.



When posting on Instagram find your niche that you are passionate and comfortable with. Develop your own style and focus on a specific genre or subject. Give your images a specific look.

Furthermore, you should only publish images you are proud of and follow a consistent publication schedule. The average posting pace on Instagram for photographers is at least once a day, not including temporary content.

Some 10 tips for posting on Instagram (humbly provided)

- 1. Be authentic and true to yourself.
- 2. Find an audience you can maintain.
- 3. Show the whole picture with carousel posts.
- 4. Understand the power of video content.
- 5. Share your knowledge with others.
- 6. Make the most out of Instagram Stories.
- 7. Say goodbye to geotagged locations.

The information out there is overflowing with tips, examples, invitations, you name it. Should you need more inspiration, go to dear old Google and ask for assistance and read with a discriminate eye.

Every photographer's dream - the good photograph – Thelma van der Schyff From June 2015 e-Flash

Our set subject for this month set me thinking about structure. I realised we need structure in everything in our lives. Without structure there is chaos. Without structure you will fall prone to procrastination, be disorganised and then get discouraged. Think about it – your working day can be like this, your household can be like this, but then so can your photography be like this. Many a despondent photographer has felt a holiday or outing has been a total waste of time because he did not think about what and how he wanted to tackle this.

People might fear that adding structure to their lives they will make them lose creativity and flexibility. This is in fact just the opposite. Structure can help you create more time for those things that add value to your life

How do you do that? I always say to my family: How do you eat a whale? One bite at a time. Do not make it too complicated or too big. You may find it proactive to create reminders for yourself. In the days before I was relieved of all my camera equipment, I had a little red book in my camera bag where I wrote reminders for myself about settings for different subjects and occasions. When I would come upon a difficult setting, I will look in my little red book and see what worked last time.

In photo composition we have four structural elements: shape, form, pattern and texture. If you want to shoot different images being elevated above the ordinary, you will have to identify potential - shoot different angles, change the lighting etc.

Shape

Shape is two-dimensional. You can identify many subjects by shape without colour of surface visible. A strong silhouette will show a car, cat or building clearly. Keep the angle in mind – there is

always an angle that will make you subject more identifiable. It helps if the background is clean without noise.

<u>Form</u>

Form is three dimensional. It gives depth to a subject. Here the use of light and shadows are very important. The ideal light is side light which is not too direct or too strong. Diffused light can be of great advantage, such as a partly cloudy day to emphasize form.

Pattern

This is a powerful tool. Patterns are all around us every day. A good photographer learns to see it wherever he goes. This refers to repetition of shapes, texture or form. This topic is endless. It can be chimneys on roofs, rows of trees, windows, buildings.... a telephoto lens as well as a macro lens will come in handy.

Texture

Texture is often something you can literally feel with your fingers, like the bark of a tree, a rough brick or wall, or an animal's fur. These photo's often isolate a small piece of the object, and shape and form are no longer relevant. These are often your macro shots. Light and shadow play an important role here, as the this emphasizes the texture.



Ruin by Ken Rockwell

In an article by Ken Rockwell, he demonstrates some of the principles by means of his photograph called "Ruin." Here we have a big red diamond in the middle, surrounded by blue-grey. The big rectangle is the obvious positive space. The big blue-Gray around it is called negative space. Red jumps out at you, especially when put in front of blue.

He used an ultra-wide lens which gets darker in the corners. This effect is called falloff. It causes the centre to be relatively brighter adding emphasis.

Some pictures need to be in colour. If this picture was in black and white there would be little or no contrast between the red and the blue. This picture grabs you even as a thumbnail. That is a good guideline – it must be striking even as a thumbnail. This means aiming to get it right in the camera. Do not rely too strongly on Photoshop to get a striking image.

When a photographer knows how he got his winning photograph, he will be able to achieve the results again at the next opportunity. That is where structure comes in. The person who gets a winning photograph by luck will not be able to repeat his performance.

My last word is like the last word in a joke, called a punch line. An image needs a punch line to be striking. It is like the good ending to a movie. The punch line is what you find after you look around the image. It can be a row of soldiers and at the end of the row one is doing or wearing something different.

You even get double punch lines. That is when you have something in the photograph reacting to something else in the photograph.

A photographer called Jay Maisel has photos where you have a train window with a person looking out the window, but then you will notice someone in the next car looking back in surprised response to the first person. The double punch line.

Enjoy structuring your lives, and enjoy this extraordinary picture by Jay Maisel. It is worth it to go onto the web and look at the work of jay Maisel. Lots of joy.
