Hi everyone,

One of my favourite tasks each month is to decide on which photo to put on the cover of the newsletter. This month was really special, because as soon as I saw it, I thought "If by some chance, this one is not amongst the formal winners, then this is the cover"! And luckily for me, I was able to use it! I think it's super stunning!

One of the reasons I love the shot so much is because, when I attended the JAP course in 2021/2022, I was introduced, via the course's subject matter, to a photographer called Eileen Rafferty. She's American and does various YouTube instructional videos with B&H. After watching the course prescribed video, I then went and watched a few of her other videos. In one, she said something which really struck a chord. She said she was asked by a fellow tog while they were out shooting together "What's the first thing you do when we get to a scene?", and she replied "I look for the light, I look for the most beautiful light first"! And to me, that's exactly what Annelize's image epitomises - she found the most beautiful light! So - thanks Annelize - for the memory, and the image! Beautifully captured.

A couple of months back I had a mild rant about everyone who entered the PSSA salon having to submit RAW files to "authenticate" their entries. Firstly, I would <u>never</u> submit images that were not my own, but secondly, at least for this exercise I was able to locate the necessary images. I recently received an email from the PSSA reading as follows: "I'm pleased to inform you that your images have successfully passed the audit with a 100% compliance rate." This is great, but my issue with all this is that I was simply fortunate this time - I don't have, nor do I want to have, disk after disk filled with RAW images. Once I have finalised the image I wanted to end up with, as standard practice I normally delete as many RAW files as I can to conserve space - and sometimes I can delete some that I shouldn't by mistake.

Now the question is - with a system that basically presumes one guilty unless proved innocent, what if I had deleted or could not locate the RAW image of a file I had submitted to a salon? Would I then be classified as "dodgy", or "dishonest"? The situation could easily happen - sometimes I have looked at a "completed" image some months after finalising it, see an issue that I would like to tweak, and then can't find the original file as it's been deleted! So I reluctantly made the decision not to take the chance and consequently have not submitted a salon entry since the audit. And that makes me sad.

Anyway, to finish on a positive note, we have other members making big strides in salons. Both Johan van Wyk and Frans du Bois recently received awards. Unfortunately both of them are away at the moment, but I hope to bring us those fantastic images next month. The special images at the end of this newsletter are all COMs received at last month's competition.






